

# *Heirs to Ahmegotheho*

*A family Saga by Garry Victor Hill*

## *Introduction*

This novel is in the tradition of the family sagas with the differences that it has multiple narrators, an Australian setting and goes into the twenty-first century.

The central character, Ross Clarke, is in the outward mould of the traditional hero, but we see inside his mind, so we see how power and privilege are upheld, how soldiers really fight and how money is really made.

We also see inside a rural community and how life there develops in one long lifetime, from 1895 to 2005.

Other characters also develop the story and while events in Australia remain the centre of the story, settings range over the world. These include South Africa in the Boer War, West Virginia, Gallipoli and the Light Horse campaigns in Palestine. The establishing of flight line between London and Australia in the 1920s and 1930s, takes up much of the story. In World War Two the settings range from the Battle of Britain to the New Guinea campaign. England and Sydney in the swinging sixties show a different world.
